Hiram Adsit, for 35 years a resident of Butler county, died at his home in Fairview township, Thursday, Septomber 26, 1919, of inflammatory rheumatism. The funeral will be held from the home Saturday, Sept. 27, at 2:00 o'clock. The service will be conducted by Rev. D. Diamond Mitchell, pastor of the Presbyterian church, and burial will be in Towanda cemeery Mr. Adsit with his family came to El Dorado December 25, 1884, and took possession of the McGinnis farm, southeast of town, where Mrs. Adsit died February 14, 1885. In 1910 he nurchased the Charles Baker farm in Fairview where he has since resided. When oil was discovered north and west of El Dorado he leased his farm to the Empire and that company now has several wells on the lease. Mr. Adsit was the father of nine children, seven of whom survive. He is also survived by three brothers and one Isister, all living in Pennsylvania. One brother, Fred Adsit, is here for the funeral.
