I Certify that In Conformity with the 3^d Section of the Law of the United States of the 4th July 1836 Anna Baugman of New York Widow of Charles Baugman deceased, who was a Sergeant of Artillery in the War of the Revolution, is entitled to receive one hundred and twenty dollars per annum during the time she may remain unmarried commencing on the 4th of March 1834 and payable semiannually on the 4th of March and the 4th of September

That she is entitled to a pension of one hundred and twenty dollars per annum for services my deceased husband Charles Baugman a Sergeant in Captain Broadwells Company in Colonel Cranes Regiment in the Artillery rendered the United States during the Revolutionary War, while said sum of one hundred and twenty dollars per annum is now due to me the said Anna Baugman as the Widow of the said Charles Baugman from the fourth day of March 1834 to the fourth day of September 1837 and so to continue so long as I remain unmarried, In Conformity with the 3^d Section of the Law of the United States of the 4th July 1836, I the said Anna Baugman was born and brought up in the Town of Woodbury in the County of Dutchess in the State of Connecticut, where I lived until I moved from thence to the Town of Windham in the County of Green and State of New York where I have lived for more than twenty years and where I now live

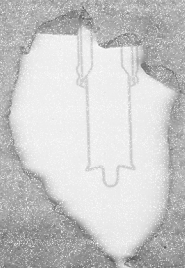

The records on file in this office show that Charles Baugman (name also spelled Beaumeau) was appointed a sergeant of Captain William Traskwell's Company of the 3rd Artillery Regiment of Continental Troops, February 14 - 1777 - and that he enlisted for the period of three years - but the date and place of his enlistment are not shown. His name is borne on the rolls of his company up to,

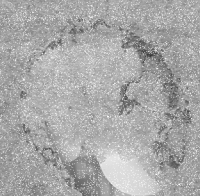
