I Michael M. Beaujean, being of sound disposing
mind & memory, do hereby make publish & declare
this my last will & testament, in manner & form fol-
lowing to wit.

First, I will & direct that all debts, shall be paid, &
the funeral expenses of myself & wife, & that suitable Grav
Stones, costing not less than twenty ~~five~~ ^{five} dollars for each of
us, shall be procured & set in a proper manner.

Second, I will that my wife shall be supported from
& have the use & control of all my real & personal estate
during her natural life.

Third I will, devise & bequeath all my real estate, to my
grandson George R. Beaujean, to have & to hold to him
his heirs & assigns forever. charged however with the pay-
ment to my son Eusebius Beaujean, of two hundred ^{dollars},
in case that myself & wife shall not survive after this date
the period of one year & a half, but if either should
thus survive then the whole to be his, without any charge
thereon. The said sum of two hundred dollars, is to be
paid, to be paid in three years after my death, in e-
qual annual installments, the first to be paid in one
year after my decease.

Fourth. Having heretofore provided for all my ^{other}
children, it is not my design, to provide further, ^{for} them,
but to secure the property to my said grandson for
his services in taking care of myself & wife in our old
age.

Fifth. I do hereby appoint Thomas A. Osborne of May-
ville my executor of this my last will, hereby revoking
all other wills by me made.
