N the 4 h day of November 1768, died at Litchfield, MARY BUELL, widow of Juhn Buell, E q; deceas'd, aged about omery years. She was born to Windlor, where the was married at about feventeen years of age, and thereupon remo ed to Lebaran, where he lived with her hulband in it e molt agreeable manner, till the year 1720, when they removed with their family to Luchfield, being a molt respectable part of the neft feetlers of this township. Where, cooringing in all the ordinances of the hord blamelels, they enjoyed abundant profperity, friendship and happiness, even amidit the unavoidable hardthips and fatigues, incident to the first and principal planters in such a remote wilderness-and where, having long fulls ned, and ever discharged with honor and fidelity, feveral important officer in church and flate, anno 1746. He patiently fübmitted to a painful illnofe, and exulting in a bieffed hope of affurance of a glorious immertality beyond the dark curtain of diffolution-cheatfully leaving his well beloved wife and children in poff fion of a goodly inheritance together with the more walumble legacy of fharing largely in those peculiar b chings which lelcom fall to attend and follow the fortheps of the rightcous, even dewn to potteriey-In his life, and at his death frequently inculcating, and perforally exh biring à lively specimen of the truth of that important observation on facred record, that " godinefe .. is profitable to the life that now is and that " which is to come." Whom the furvived, a confpicuous pattern of patte et and benevolence. a thining example of pey and devotion, and amiable mirror of every christian grace, gvety focial, relative and practical virtoe will file could enumerate 410 of her own offspring, whereof 336 furvived her.
