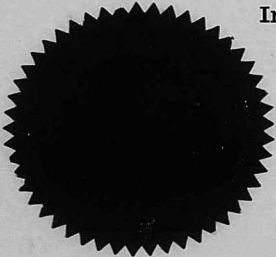

who being by me duly sworn, according to law, on his oath doth declare and say, that it is *bona fide* his intention to become a Citizen of the United States, and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and particularly to *the Emperor of Germany*

of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, of which *Emperor* he is at this time a subject.
