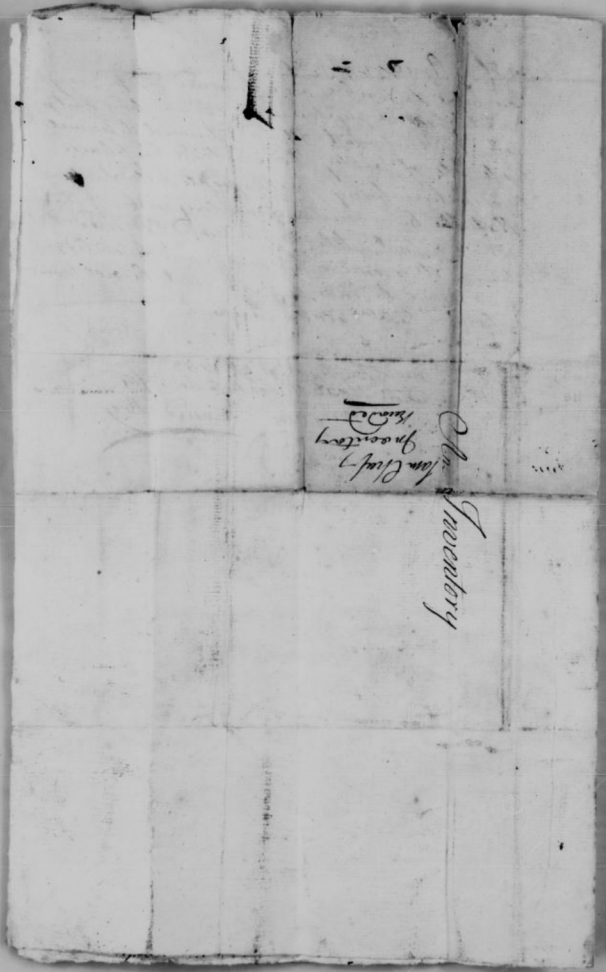

 Spanish which she has had  
 Item I Give unto my Daughter Sarah Parker one pair of  
 wheels one pair of plows one table and two Dollars  
 and the two thirds of one Dollar to be paid her in three  
 years after my decease by my son John Good  
 Item I Give unto my three Daughters Martha Good Susanna  
 Buffum and Sarah Parker and also my two Grand Daughters  
 Elizabeth Hill and Sarah Buffum all my lands and goods  
 except what I have here in hand to sell or sell in hand or for
