Heftman's "Historical Register" gives Joseph Conway's record in the Revolutionary War as follows:
"Joseph Conway, Ensign 14th Virginia, 24th July 1777; and Lieut. 22nd Dec. 1777; Regiment designated 10th Va., Sep. 14, 1778, taken prisoner at Charleston May 12, 1780, 1st Lieutenant July 15, 1780, transferred to 1st Virginia 12th, Feb. 1781. Served to end of the war."

"Joseph Conway was an original member of the Sons of Cincinnati, the society formed by Washington of the officers of the Continental Army."

KY Granted 3,110 66/100 ac by Rev War Bounty Land Warrant #1627, dated 8/22/1783. 7 yrs Lt., VA Line. record also found in book "Old Kentucky Entries and Deeds", Military Warrants section.

Since he died in Cocke Co., TN abt 1807, the KY land warrant may have been the legacy that brought his heirs, possibly including Sarah Conway, by then wife of Amos Goodman, to Kentucky.

Records in Greene Co. TN show brothers William, George, Henry and Joseph Conway settled there between 1780-1790. Joseph came there from Virginia by way of Highland Co. Ohio where he had received a RW land grant for 3110 acres. His will, written in Cocke Co. TN but probated in Highland Co. OH (Record Book A, page 191) lists wife, Sarah, sons Edward Turner, Joseph, Peter, Charles, William Turner, unborn child (later James Turner Porter); daughters Elizabeth and Sarah. Indications are that one of children remained in Ohio (Charles?).
