THOMAS CONWAY (Will)

Date: 25 August 1784

Son: William (oldest son) - one negro Woman named Moll  
& her child named Nell

Son: Thomas - my Tract of land on Town Run being the  
same he lives on

Son: Peter - part of the Tract of land I now live on,  
beginning at a marked white Oak near a branch  
that run through Joseph Blackwell's old field ex-  
tending thence along a marked line to Smith's line,  
it being the part he now lives on.

Son: Joseph - the remaining part of the Tract of Land  
I live on including the land above the Road to  
the marked line above mentioned, this being the  
part my House stands on

Son: Henry - my Tract of land in Shenandoe County

Dau.: Susanne Crosby - the sum of L5

Gr.son: James Conway, the Son of James Conway - one young

Negro to be chosen from among my Slaves by my  
Executor (if he should die to go to Estate)

Gr. son: George Crosby - a Negro boy to be chosen by my  
Executor out of my Slaves (if he should die  
to go to Estate)

\_\_\_\_\_: Sally Mauzy, a young Woman born and raised in  
my House - a negro Girl named Peg  
... all my Negroes, excepting those by this Will  
already bequeathed, & all the rest of my move-  
able Estate (excepting one Bed & Furniture which  
I gave to my Son Joseph Conway) shall be equally  
divided among my five Sons William, Thomas, Peter,  
Henry, Joseph & whereas Some of my Sons are now  
in Possession of Negroes which I have formerly  
lent them, but to which they have no legal Title  
by Deed or otherwise my Intention is that such  
Negroes so lent be still considered as part of my  
Estate & subject to the General Division above  
ordered.

My desire is that my Executors do commence &  
prosecute a Suit against John Markham for the  
recovery of two Negroe Men named Joseph & Kit  
which I formerly lent to the s'd Markham & which  
he has hitherto refused to redeliver to me.

Exors: Sons William Conway, Thomas Conway & Joseph Conway  
Signed: Thos. Conway  
Wit.: Peter Grant, John Smith, Ann (X) Smith  
Codicil: I, Thomas Conway, upon more mature reflection do  
will & desire that the Land I live on may be de-  
vided into two equal parts. the one of which I  
hereby give to my Son Peter .. & the other to my  
Son Joseph .. My Son Peter having previously  
agreed that his Brother Joseph shall have his  
choice of the two parts.

Signed: Thomas Conway (same witnesses as above)  
Proved: 27 September 1784 by o. of Peter Grant & John  
Smith and Ann Smith. Cert. granted William  
Conway, Thomas Conway & Joseph Conway to obtain  
probate.
