that I will support the Constitution of the United States of America, and that I do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure forever all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign power, prince, potentate, state or sovereignty whatever, and particularly to the *King* of the *Kingdom* of *Great Britain & Ireland* whose subject I was: And further, that I never have borne any hereditary title, or been of any of the degrees of nobility of the *Kingdom* of *Great Britain and Ireland*.
