

The Modern Woodmen, it will be remembered, contested Mrs. Frank Heath's \$1,000 insurance policy on the theory that her husband committed suicide and the Order was not liable. She won the suit which the defendant company proposed to appeal but failed to perfect its appeal. In ordinary cases a year is given to make appeal but the law provides that in insurance cases of this kind the appeal must be made within 60 days. The company has slept on its rights, the time for carrying the case up expired January 25. Mooney & Stratford, attorneys for Mrs. Heath have called State Commissioner Luling's attention to the fact that the law is mandatory as to suspension of companies refusing to pay, and the presumption is that Mrs. Heath will soon get her money.
