

JOSEPH H. BERRY

Joseph H. Berry, 78, 1236 Lipan street, one-time Denver alderman and state senator and engineer on the first Rock Island train to come into Denver, died Tuesday, Nov. 22, at a Denver hospital after a short illness. Born in Chicago in 1865, Mr. Berry came to Denver in 1881, entering the service of the Denver & Rio Grande railroad as fireman. In 1888 he became an engineer for the Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific railroad, retiring from active duty in 1930. In 1904, Mr. Berry was elected alderman of the 11th ward. He served as state senator from 1912 to 1916 as a Democrat. He and Mrs. Berry, his only survivor, would have celebrated their 47th wedding anniversary Wednesday.
