 grown in years and Calling to mind the uncertainty of this life on
 earth and I being desirous to settle things before I die do make this my
 last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to wit
 first and principally I Commit my soul to God that gave it me humbly
 depending upon the precious death and meritts of Iesus Christ my only
 Lord for saluation and the free pardon of all my sins and my body to the
 earth from whence it was taken to be buried in such decent and Christian
 manner as to my executors hereafter named shall be thought fit and as
 for my outward and worldly estate my will and meaning is the same
 shall be followed and Imployed as hereafter by this my will is expressed
 and first I do revoke renounce and make void all wills by me formerly made
 and I do declare and appoint this to be my last will and Testament to
 stand and remain in full force forever.

Imp I Give and bequeath unto my son Ebenezer Ridor all my real estate
 that is to say my now dwelling house and barn with all the lot of
 land they stand upon from the high way saffortly to the brook and my
 and my land and brckand on the other side of the sd high way lying
 between the lands of Nathaniel Baffot and my son John Ridor's land
 and also all my land and meadow in the prime field together with my
 marsh at Grays beach and my Island of brook stuff or soogo at the
 brook creek and also two oson and two bowes all which sd housing lands
 and marshes and soogo grounds my sd son Ebenezer shall have and
 hold to him his heirs and assigns forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my son John Ridor ten shillings of my estate

Item I Give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Ridor five shillings of my estate



Item I Give to my two daughters Hannah & Lydia four shillings a piece

Item I Give and bequeath unto my daughter Thankfull ten pounds
 my will further is that the rest of my estate that is not herein
 disposed of if any be shall be equally divided to my above named
 four children to each one a like part thereof

Lastly I do Nominate appoint and Impower my above named son
 Ebenezer Ridor to be sole executor to this my will and Testament
