Witnesseth, That the said Samuel Holmes & wife for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars



current money of the United States, to them in hand paid, the receipt whereof they hereby acknowledge and forever

and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien and confirm, unto the said Reuben Sheppard his  
heirs and assigns forever, all the right, title and interest of, in and to the following described Inn Lot in the Town of New

Together with all improvements, watercourses, profits and appurtenances whatsoever, to the said premises belonging or in any wise appertaining,  
and the reversions, remainders and profits thereof, and all the estate, right, title, interest, property, claim and demand of them the said Samuel  
Holmes and Catharine his wife of, in and to the same: To have and to hold the lot hereby conveyed, with all and singular the  
premises and every part and parcel thereof, with every of the appurtenances, unto the said Reuben Sheppard his heirs and  
assigns forever, to the only proper use and behoof of them the said Reuben Sheppard his heirs and assigns  
forever. And the said Samuel Holmes and his heirs, executors and administrators, do covenant, promise  
and agree, to and with the said Reuben Sheppard his heirs and assigns, by these presents, that the premises  
before mentioned now are, and forever hereafter shall remain free of and from all former and other gifts, grants, bargains, sales, dowers, right and  
title of dower, judgments, executions, titles, troubles, charges and incumbrances whatsoever, done or suffered to be done, by them the said Samuel

hereby bargained and sold, with the appurtenances unto the said Reuben Sheppard his heirs and assigns,  
against them the said Samuel Holmes and wife and their heirs, and all and every other person or persons  
whatsoever, doth and will warrant and forever defend by these presents:
