

BULLETS IN BRAIN

**THEODORE SHEPHARD AN AGED MAN,
KILLED HIMSELF AT HARVEY-
VILLE MONDAY.**

Despondent because of the weight of years and continued ill health Theodore Shepard, 74 years of age, killed himself at Harveyville late Monday afternoon by firing a ball from a 32-calibre revolver into his head. Twice the cartridges failed to explode, one ball went wild and the fourth trial was successful, entering the temple.

The suicide occurred at the home of his son Charles, with whom since the death of his wife some years ago the deceased has resided. He was for some years a merchant at Wilmington and later lived on a farm, but still more recently the father and son moved to Harveyville.

The information of the Chronicle is that when the suicide occurred Mr. Shepard was alone in the house except for some young children. The deceased was well known all over this section. He has another son, Walter, residing some place in Missouri.

The funeral was held at Harveyville yesterday afternoon.
