The condi^on that if the said Wil^m Corvannell shall appeare at the next Generall Court to be holden for this go^ument, to answer all such matters as shalbe objected against him on his ma^{ties} behalf, for receiueing his money againe of Edward Shaw, before he was bound to p^{ro}secute against him for the felonious taking of the same priuily from him, and not de^{pr} the Court wthout lycence, &c.

It is ordered by the Court, that those w^{ch} were chosen the last yeare to bee added to the Go^uner & Assistant^d to assesse men to the publike charges of the colony shall also doe it this yeare; and shall likewise consider what charge will erect a prison at Plymouth, and forthth also leavy the same, that a prison may be p^{re}sently erected.
