John Sprague was killed in what is known as "Pierce's Fight" in King Phillip's War. Al but 9 of the colonials were killed and the remaining 9 were captured and tortured to death by the Indians. A monument known as the "Nine Men's Misery". A stone table marks the site in current Cumberland, RI.
