Joseph WINZER

Civil War Union volunteer from Pittsburh, PA. He enlisted on 20 April 1861 and was mustered in on 1 May 1861 and was mustered out on 12 May 1864. He was a private in Captain Henry Fuhren's Company B, 9th regiment of Infantry.

Mustered out 12 May 1864 in Pittsburgh. Unit was at the time fighting in the Battle of Wilderness. Was fined 25 cents for losing his gun sling in Nov/Dec 1863

He was married by Rev Wilhelm Schmidt in Cleveland 18th May 1864.

Joseph Winzer immigrated to the United States in October 1856. This is he date that he gave for his arrival on his Declaration of Intention filed in the Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas on 1 August 1857. On this form he renounced his allegiance to Frederic. Prince Regent of Baden.

Joseph was a private in Co. B. 9th Reg't., PA Reserve Corps from 1 May 1861 to 12 May 1864 in the War of the Rebellion. His military papers show him present at every Company Muster Roll every two months for

three years. He received a veteran's disability pension for rheumatism, starting in March 1892, of \$6.00 a month. The records show that at age 58 his height was 5'4" and he weighed 124 pounds. According to his grand-daughter, Ruby Beckenbach, he had a brother named Gustave and the two lived together until Joseph married. Of Joseph' three children, Lillie was the only one to have a child. His son Emil is listed as single on the later census reports. His youngest daughter Olga was married, and around 1920 she and her husband Fred Leland moved to Canada. Fred wanted to be a rancher and they settled in Thompson, about 28 miles south of Medicine Hat, Alberta. His mother was born in Canada and it might be that she was from that area. However, after a few years of unsuccessful ranching, in 1923 they moved to Los Angeles for a short time and then located in Spokane, Washington where Fred returned to his former occupation of watchmaker. They adopted a young girl. Ethel. probably around 1924. She was born in 1914 and died in 1935.
