Notes

Thomas Woodmansee

He was a mariner later a yeoman (a man who owns and cultivates a small estate) in Monmouth County, Jersey, where he established his home north of Tinton Falls, two and one half miles southwest of Shrewsbury. This was not until 1704, however, he having up to that time, it is believed, been occupied on the sea, as his father before him. Thomas was married to Hannah(Williams?) and later to Mary Ware, daughter of Thomas Ware. In Thomas Woodmansee's will, written 22 September 1733 and proved 18 June 1737 in Shrewsbury, Monmouth County, Mary was named as executrix, acting with George Williams Littel of Shrewsbury (see NOTES 5 & 6 on pages 23-24 of this book). He is not mentioned as a co-executor in Leo H. Garman's article, "Early Woodmansees in America"

Thomas died not long after he wrote his will;
