*Remarks.* This Township is situated between the Monongahela & Youngbushing rivers, 2 1/2 miles South of Pittsburg. Its surface is somewhat uneven, yet is very fertile; its hills abound with bituminous coal, & limestone is found in abundance, both in the hills & in the valleys.
